Catechists

Catechists are called by Christ to teach the faith in a classroom setting in either a school or parish faith formation program; they may be paid or volunteer.

In addition to providing religious instruction, the catechist nurtures the seeds of faith imparted at Baptism so the Christian may bear great fruit. Catechesis forms the whole person, so they may know God and how to respond to His great Love with faith, hope, and charity. From first evangelization, through initiation, to lifelong discipleship, catechesis provides the sure foundation for the Christian life. Catechists accompany their students, helping them to live and bear witness to the faith in the world, preparing them for their eternal reward.

Diocesan Policies and Guidelines

Catechists must be “practicing Catholics with a thorough knowledge of the Christian message and the ability to communicate it completely, faithfully, and enthusiastically; they should also meet diocesan standards for certification as a catechist” (NDC 54, Ch. 8, p. 232).

All Catechists must:

- Be a practicing Catholic in good standing with the Catholic Church;
- Be 18 years or older (See the Code of Conduct.);
- Be in full compliance with the Office for the Protection of Children/Young People (OPCYP) before beginning and while serving in ministry;
- Be committed to present and witness to the authentic teachings of the Church, and sign an Oath of Fidelity; and
- Be willing to continue their ministry training, and work towards certification.

All catechists must strive to acquire the knowledge and skills needed to communicate the faith effectively. They must have a solid understanding of Catholic doctrine and worship, Scripture and Tradition, and Church history. Catechists must have the necessary communication skills and ability to use various methodologies with their students; they must understand how people grow and mature, and how persons of different ages and circumstances learn.

Catechists must continue their faith formation (e.g., Scripture, Catechism, Church history, etc.), as well as training in faith development, learning styles, teaching methods, and ministry-specific catechesis (e.g., teaching children with special learning needs, etc.).

Catechist Training

Directors of Religious Education must make it a priority to equip their catechists with the training to effectively teach and share the faith with their students. Catechist training will nurture the faith of the catechist, and teach them to impart this faith to their students effectively. With a solid foundation in Church teaching, catechists may teach beyond the classroom materials and more confidently engage students.

There are many benefits to catechist training, the foremost being better formed Catholics. Where catechist training occurs universally and systematically, cohesion in the catechetical program and unity among catechists is evident. Furthermore, catechists who commit to ongoing training bring stability to parish programs and long-term service to the ministry.

The Diocese of Arlington will provide local and diocesan workshops, institutes, conferences, and online (internet-based) classes to assist catechists in attaining appropriate training. Also, the Diocese of Arlington has established relationships with local apostolates to provide excellent catechist certification opportunities.

Catechist Certification

Catechists should strive to attain diocesan catechist certification in a timely manner, in order to grow in their faith and best serve in their ministry. Directors of Religious Education have a responsibility to make catechist certification training known and available through either online or onsite training opportunities. The Diocese will offer scholarship funds or subsidies for catechist certification training as outlined below.

There are three levels of Catechist Certification:

- 1) Basic Catechist Certification**
- 2) Specialized Catechist Certification**
- 3) Master Catechist Certification**

Basic Catechist Certification

Basic Catechist Certification is strongly encouraged for every catechist in the Diocese of Arlington. It is designed to recognize catechists with a sound foundation in the faith as well as the resources and training necessary to teach in the elementary classroom.

Requirements for Basic Catechist Certification:

- A completed Basic Catechist Certification Application Form;
- A signed Catechist Oath of Fidelity; and
- 50 hours of **verified course work (transcripts required with a final grade of 80%+)** in the following areas:
 - ✓ **10 hours of study in Catechetical Ministry Training**
 - ✓ **10 hours of study of the Creed**
 - ✓ **10 hours of study of the Sacraments**
 - ✓ **10 hours of study of the Moral Life**
 - ✓ **10 hours of study of Prayer and Tradition**

The Diocese has partnered with three local apostolates that offer Basic Catechist Certification courses for Arlington catechists:

**Catholic Distance University
Catholic Education Center
Institute of Catholic Culture**

The **Franciscan University of Steubenville Catechetical Institute** also offers courses which may be used towards Basic Catechist Certification, so long as the coursework is verified and meets the requirements noted above.

Basic Certification may be attained using coursework from more than one apostolate.

Renewal:

- **Basic Catechist Certification must be renewed every three years with an additional 10 hours of study in any area noted above.**
- **Renewal hours may include diocesan-approved seminars and workshops, as well as the Diocesan Catechetical Conference.** Renewal hours may not include homilies or days of recollection.
- Those with an **expired** Basic Catechist Certification must demonstrate they have satisfied the Basic Catechist Certification requirements (above) after 2008, plus an additional 10 hours of study in any area noted above to renew their Basic Catechist Certification. Otherwise, they may re-apply for Basic Catechist Certification.
- Those who have a **current** Basic Catechist Certification may work towards Specialized Catechist Certification.

Diocesan-Approved Basic Catechist Certification Courses

Coursework verified with transcripts/certificates of completion provided by apostolates; a grade of 80%+ is required.

Basic Certification Courses: Participants must self-pay.

Courses from the Franciscan University of Steubenville Catechetical Institute may be used to attain or renew Basic Catechist Certification. Courses must be verified and in the areas of study to satisfy the Basic Catechist Certification requirements in Arlington Diocese.

Specialized Catechist Certification

Catechists must have a Basic Catechist Certification before they may attain Specialized Catechist Certification.

Specialized Catechist Certification recognizes those who are trained to teach high school students, adults, or areas of specialty.

Requirements for Specialized Catechist Certification:

- A completed Specialized Catechist Certification Application Form;
- A signed Catechist Oath of Fidelity; and
- 50 hours of verified course work (Grade: 80+%, transcript required) in **one** of the following areas:
 - Classroom Methods and Management
 - Biblical Catechesis/Scripture
 - Ministry Coordination and Leadership
 - Church History
 - Catechetical Tradition
 - Morality
 - Evangelization and Discipleship
 - Apologetics
 - Faith Formation and Spirituality

Master Catechist Certification

The Master Catechist Certification program trains those who teach youths or adults and/or who are expected to provide support to others in the faith formation programs of a parish (DREs or Lay Faith Formation Ministers).

Christendom College Graduate School of Theology offers the two-year Master Catechist Certification program every other year. **Courses may be taken for academic credit and used towards a Master of Arts in Theology** (see <https://graduate.christendom.edu> for details).

- Applications are accepted by the **Office of Faith Formation** every other year for a two-year program (next cohort begins 2021). A registration package will be sent to parishes.
- Applications require the approval/signature of the Pastor.
- Classes meet on eight Saturday mornings during the Fall/Spring semesters and run asynchronously online during Summer semester (do not meet during Summer).
- Classes may be upgraded for academic credit towards a Masters in Arts degree.
- Fall/Spring courses can be taken in any modality or combination of the following modalities: on-campus, live online, or asynchronously (pre-recorded).

Requirements for Master Catechist Certification:

- A completed Master Catechist Certification Application Form;
- A signed Catechist Oath of Fidelity; and
- Proof of successful completion of the Christendom Graduate School of Theology Master Catechist program (transcript).

Note: Those who have earned a Christendom College Graduate School of Theology Certificate in Systematic Theology or Evangelization and Catechesis prior to 2021 have fulfilled the course requirements for the Master Catechist Certification in the Diocese of Arlington.

Renewal:

- Master Catechist Certification must be renewed every three years with an additional 10 hours of verified study in one area of specialty (see Specialized Catechist Certification above).

Director of Religious Education Training

Director of Religious Education (DRE)

The single most critical factor in an effective parish catechetical program is the leadership of a professionally trained Director of Religious Education. The DRE instills heart and wisdom into the structured parish catechetical program. The DRE works closely with the pastor and the Office of Faith Formation to build a program that aligns with Diocesan Policies and Guides; they also implement this program with pastoral care for both the catechists and students in the program. With an eye to the eternal, the DRE works to proclaim the Word of God through evangelization and catechesis. Discerning the formation needs of the parish and prayerfully realizing them, the DRE nurtures the faith of parishioners through word and witness.

Diocesan Policies and Guidelines

Directors of Religious Education must possess the necessary personal qualities, catechetical understanding and skills, organizational and administrative abilities, academic preparation, and professional experience to direct the entire faith formation program of the parish. They must be able to recruit volunteers and provide catechist training, select curriculum resources, provide program design for all age levels, and manage and supervise staff (both paid and volunteer).

Only fully initiated, practicing Catholics who fully adhere to the Church's teaching on faith and morals and who are models of Christian virtue and courageous witnesses to the Catholic faith should be designated as parish catechetical leaders (NDC 54, Ch. 8, p. 224)

The following are the required qualifications for a Director of Religious Education:

- Must be approved by the Episcopal Vicar of Faith Formation;
- Be a practicing Catholic in good standing;
- Have the skills necessary to effectively fulfill this position, including but not limited to catechetical expertise, leadership and team-building skills, and relational skills that bear witness to the love of Christ;
- **A Master's degree in Religious Education, Theology or related field is preferred; Master Catechist Certification is required.**
- Be willing to continue professional development in areas that will benefit the faith formation program of the parish;
- Be willing to work with the Office of Faith Formation of the Diocese of Arlington, and to implement a unified accredited faith formation program in the local community;
- Must be an active member of the CLDA (Catechetical Leaders of the Diocese of Arlington);
- Be willing to serve and build up the faith formation program in the parish, including the school and homeschool communities, so to bring the Good News to all who live within the parish boundaries;
- Ensure the formation of catechists, who are called to share in this ministry;

- Coordinate various faith formation programs and ministries, supervising other lay faith formation employees (e.g., Adult Faith Formation Minister, High School Faith Formation Minister, etc.); and
- Follow all guidelines and requirements established by the Diocese of Arlington, and provide an annual evaluation.

Beginning January 1, 2020

Directors of Religious Education who have been employed by the Catholic Diocese of Arlington for **less than three years may receive a 50% tuition scholarship** for graduate studies at Christendom College Graduate School of Theology.

Directors of Religious Education who have been employed by the Catholic Diocese of Arlington for **three years or more may receive a 100% tuition scholarship** for graduate studies at Christendom College Graduate School of Theology.

DREs must register to take the courses for the Advanced Apostolic Catechetical Diploma and may also earn a Master of Arts in Theological Studies (in any specialization). Courses may not be taken for audit. The Diocese will cover course registration and tuition for graduate courses. All additional (actual and associated) costs of the Program (e.g. application fees, technology fees, books, supplies, materials, and transportation, etc.) are the responsibility of the DRE.

Apostolic Catechetical Diplomas: Basic and Advanced

The Christendom Graduate School is authorized by the Sacred Congregation for the Clergy to award both the Basic and the Advanced Apostolic Catechetical Diplomas. **These catechetical diplomas are distinct from the academic Master of Arts degree in Theological Studies, although the two may be earned simultaneously.** The diploma is awarded by authorization of the Holy See in recognition of the catechist's competence in the field of catechesis and his or her personal commitment to teach Catholic doctrine in communion with the Magisterium of the Catholic Church.

Instructions for Application for Catechist Certification

Applicants for Catechist Certification (any level) must submit:

- ✓ Transcripts/certificates indicating successful course completion (80%+);
