



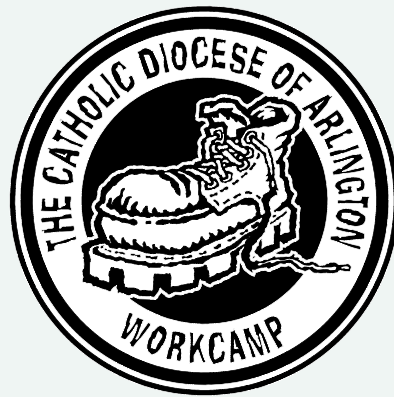
Safety

Thank you for allowing us to come into your home. This experience of service is impactful for both teen and adult volunteers which wouldn't be possible without your hospitality.

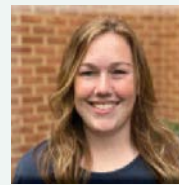
You are invited to join your crew for an Appreciation Lunch and Program on Friday, June 28th at our camp location. More details will follow.

Preparing for Volunteers



In an effort to respect the privacy and dignity of those we serve, we do not institute eligibility requirements. We are eager to serve all who are in need regardless of religious affiliation, race, physical ability, or income level.

WorkCamp

Since 1990, the Catholic Diocese of Arlington has had the privilege of sponsoring a one week youth WorkCamp for repairing and improving residences in counties within the Diocese. Approximately 800 high school teens from the Diocese are divided into crews of five and perform home repairs closely supervised by dedicated adult leaders and volunteer contractors.

Warmer, Safer, Drier

The focus of the work during the week is to make your home warmer, safer, and drier. A few examples of the work we perform include building wheelchair ramps, replacing windows, installing new doors and floors, and replacing roofs. We provide all materials, cover the cost of permit applications, and bring all necessary tools and equipment.

What to Expect

We do our best to perform the repairs that are important to you, but we may not be able to accomplish everything that you need or want due to complexity, limited time, weather, or material delays. You will work with a Project Manager to determine which repairs are most important.

Crews are scheduled to work at your home Monday June 24th through Thursday June 27th.

Before WorkCamp

Keep an eye out for materials being delivered up to two weeks prior to WorkCamp. If needed for the project, portable toilets and dumpsters will be delivered prior to our arrival.

During WorkCamp

Crews will be present each day Monday – Thursday from 9am – 4pm. They will arrive in vans with their own tools, water, and lunches. You are invited to interact with the crew and eat lunch with them if you are home. They will be sure to clean up each afternoon before departing.

After WorkCamp

If we start a project that is unfinished when the teens depart on Thursday, volunteers will return to finish it at soon as possible. During the month of July, a WorkCamp representative will stop by to assess the work and collect unused materials or trash. Porta-potties and dumpsters will be collected the week after WorkCamp by the company that delivered them.
