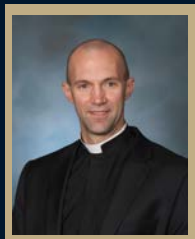

Born and raised in downtown Denver — he was baptized into the Catholic Church at the age of twenty, and immediately felt called to the priesthood. He applied to seminary through the Diocese of Arlington in 2007. After earning degrees in Philosophy and Classics, he was sent to study in Rome, and was ordained to the priesthood in 2014.

St. Ignatius of Loyola, a priest and theologian, founded The Society of Jesus (The Jesuits), becoming it's first Superior General. He is well known for his “Spiritual Exercises” developed in the mid 1500's.
